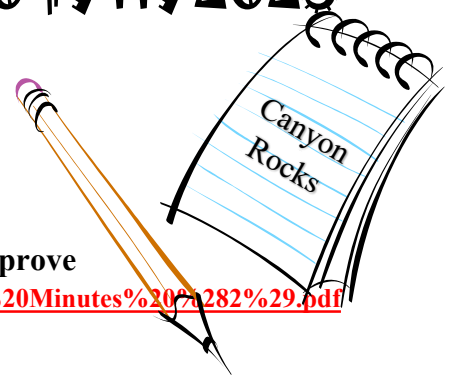

Emergency Drills/Situations Protocol

Fire

- Students line up calmly
- Turn off lights
- Close door and REMOVE magnet
- Bring red/green cards outside
- Take students to assigned spot (see map)
- Take roll/count students to see if all at school are in line WITH you...don't assume they are with someone else
- Technicians deliver students to classroom teacher spot
- Hold up red if no, green if yes
- Keep students in line (not playing)
- Wait for signal from principal to go inside

Shelter in Place

- No immediate danger but unable to leave school building (storm, environmental threat, etc.)
- Could be for beyond school hours, use emergency bucket for water and snacks.

LockDOWN

- Means danger COULD be inside school.
- Quickly look outside door to see if there are students to pull into your classroom
- Remove magnet from door and be sure it is locked
- Pull down blackout window cover and close blinds if applies
- Turn off lights and gather children away from any line of sight, keep them quiet
- Take count of students and know if someone isn't with you
- If have an "extra" student not expected to be with you, text Kasey (801) 830-8860
- Watch for texts from Nebo or Canyon Elementary for updates
- Don't share info you receive from outside sources till verified
- Do NOT open door for anyone until all clear is given by police (and door is opened by police or office staff)

LockOUT

- Means danger COULD be outside in nearby area
- Usually called for by police
- Remove door magnet while in classroom, continue teaching, no one goes outside (only move thru halls if directed to do so)

Earthquake

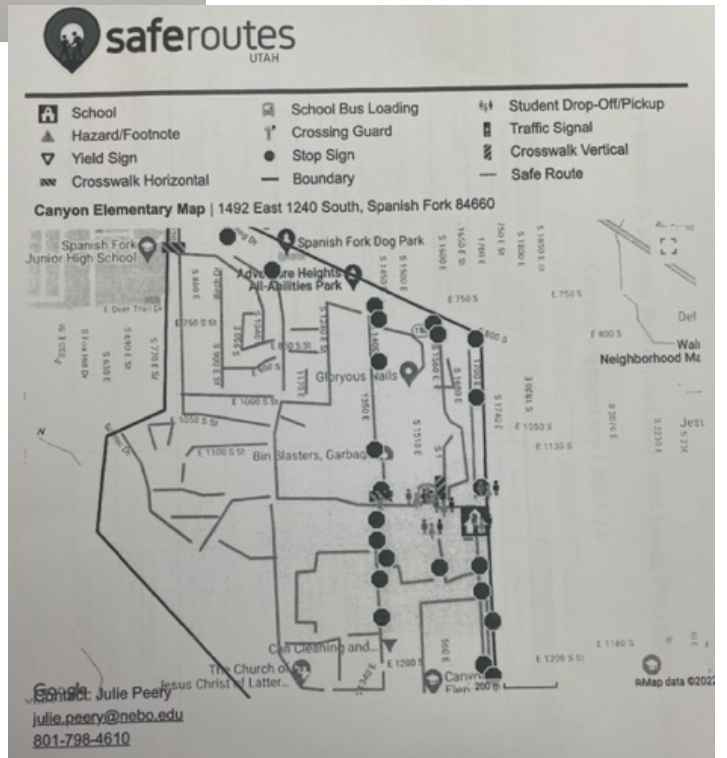
- Students drop and cover (under desks or tables while covering head)
- Keep students away from windows or bookshelves, etc.
- When rumbling has stopped, if power is on, an announcement will be made or fire alarm will sound as signal to go outside and follow fire drill procedures.
- If power isn't working, wait for five minutes of no rumbling, then go outside to line up.

Canyon Elementary School

The intent of a School Access Route Plan is not to identify every school access route or to identify the more convenient school access routes; it is to identify main walk/bike routes that appear to be secure. Care has been taken to consult with local law enforcement, school PTA and School Community Council representatives, and the District's traffic safety committee in establishing these school access routes. Despite broad consultation and unanimous agreement from all parties involved in establishing these routes, no one, including the Nebo School District and Canyon Elementary School can guarantee that the agreed upon school access routes are or will ever be completely free from hazards.

As previously stated, the intent of a School Access Route Plan is not to identify every school access route or to identify the more convenient school access routes. For this plan, school access routes leading to the school from areas where clusters of students live, have been identified and are described below.

1. Canyon is located at 1492 E 1240 S. Most all of our established school boundaries are all within the designation for walking to and from school.
2. Canyon students may access the school from alley entrance west of 1700 E just past 1310 S, alley way entrance on 1410 S cul-de-sac, and south side of 1240 S.
3. Generally, we will be using 1240 South, 1560 East, 1700 East, 1400 East, and 1100 East as collector streets for students walking to school with an emphasis to use the cross walks and crossing guard at the intersections of 1240 S 1560 E and 1240 S 1400 E. Use sidewalks, crossing at controlled intersections, crossing guards, and crosswalks where available. See the SAR map for highlighted routes.

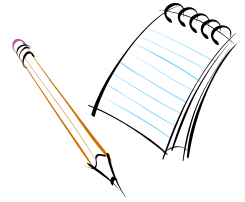
